RESULTS OF VERDEMONT COMMUNITY CENTER DOT SURVEY

The Verdemont Revitalization Project (VRP) & Kendall Hills Neighborhood Association (KHNA) used the dot survey approach to conduct research to assess the north end residents of San Bernardino's needs and preferences for the current and future permanent community center. The dot survey technique is a "self-service" research approach that asks a limited number of questions displayed on poster boards at a meeting. Residents at the meeting were given colorful, round, self-sticking dots and asked to indicate their preference to the questions posed on the poster boards by placing dots to indicate their answers or preferences to the questions posed. The dot survey technique was well-received by the residents since it is a quick, simple, and a fun way to encourage community participation and collect feedback. The dot survey was developed by Larry Lev, Linda Brewer, and Gary Stephenson of Oregon State University.

On February 27, eleven boards were displayed in the Multipurpose Room of North Verdemont Elementary. **Board one** listed options for Hours of Operation for the current community center. **Board two** listed suggestions for programs at the current community center. A suggestion box was provided directly below the board for residents to leave additional ideas for programs. **Board three** listed three options for the visual design of a permanent center. Option 1: A modest community center that allows for programs, meetings, and small to medium sized community events. Option 2: A greater sized community center that would allow for a wider variety of programs, activities, meeting and medium to large sized events. Option 3: A large community center that would allow for a much wider variety of programs, activities, meetings and

large sized events. **Board four** requested suggestions for the name of a future permanent community center. A suggestion box was provided directly below the board for residents to leave ideas for the name of a permanent community center. **Board five** listed suggestions for programs at the future center. A suggestion box was provided directly below the board for residents to leave additional ideas for programs at the permanent center. **Board six** listed location options for the future center. Option 1: Al Guhin Park. Option 2: Littlefield/Shultis Park. Option 3: Other. **Board seven** posed the question for funding ideas. A suggestion box was provided directly below the board for residents to leave ideas for funding of a permanent center. **Board eight** listed options for Hours of Operation. **Boards nine - eleven** were used to collect data about the residents. **Board nine** asked the residents what neighborhood they were from. **Board ten** posed the question, "Have you ever visited a community center in San Bernardino?" **Board eleven** posed the question "How would you like to be informed?"




Question 6: For the future community center, where do you think it should be located?




Question 8: For the future community center, what hours of operation would you prefer?




Question 9: What neighborhood do you live in?









Question 11: How do you prefer to be informed?
